Ideal CDM



- No restriction on scale, low or no transaction cost
- **Practical and country specific** in measurement of baseline and ERs.
- Easy to implement with arrangement and design by local experts
- Sufficient source of upfront finance for projects



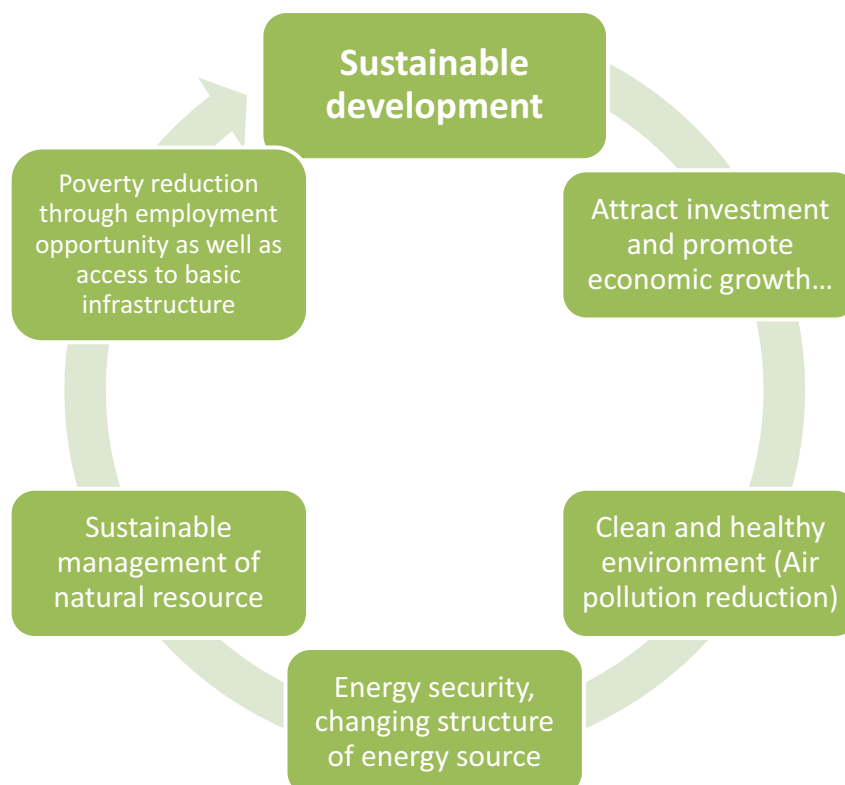
Perfect CDM from the perspective of developing country



- While reducing emission, also **contributes to adaptation** at the same time.
- In reducing GHG, being an **Effective financial mechanism** to promote activities with high social benefit and less business profit. (CER price should reflect the sustainable development contribution)
- With simple and flexible methodology (not restricting it's use for similar projects with it's applicability condition) and guidance with long term use (not changing frequently)



Objectives to accomplish by utilizing CDM.





Some specific problems in the CDM



- Methodology and guidelines (frequently changing, not fitting for specific project types and countries)
- Documentation (Lack of researches in the past and data gaps. –difficulty in setting baseline emission level and monitor)
- Expensive (high transaction cost and thus excluding small scale projects-which can not even be developed as PoA)
