Email-based discussion on Climate Change Adaptation

The Asia Pacific Adaptation Network (APAN) Exchange Series on Climate Change Adaptation is the email- based discussion operated by Institute for Global Environmental Strategies (IGES) with the support from the Ministry of the Environment of Japan (MoEJ). The Exchange seeks to capture, consolidate and share experience-based knowledge as well as strengthen community members of APAN Network and enable government officials and key practitioners to interact with experts and with each other to gain knowledge in an online space.

During 2013 and 2016, thirteen APAN Exchange Series discussions took place. The discussion topics often coincided with the theme of the major event being organized at the time. In FY2017, three online discussions were conducted via the APAN Exchange Series (14th – 16th) with an adaptation expert posting questions to existing subscribers, who include national and local government officials across Asia-Pacific working on climate change adaptation and planning, other adaptation practitioners, and development partners. The three topics of the Exchange will be relevant to the post- COP23, IGES adaptation workshop on adaptation and climate change impact assessment, and mainstreaming gender into climate change adaptation.

The 14th APAN Exchange Series was conducted and facilitated by Dr. Peter King in January 2018 focusing on "How to Use NAPs, NDCs and the SDGs to Advance Climate Resilience in Asia-Pacific". This Exchange was conducted after the outcomes of COP23 in Paris to emphasise supporting countries needs in planning for adaptation among development partners as well as consistently and effectively implementing NAPs and NDCs, and how we can use these processes, including the SDGs, to advance climate resilience in Asia and the Pacific. 

The 14th APAN Exchange Series:

How to Use NAPs, NDCs and the SDGs to Advance Climate Resilience in Asia-Pacific?



The 14th APAN Exchange on Climate Change Adaptation (email-based discussion) was conducted and facilitated by Dr. Peter King, Senior Policy Advisor of IGES from 17–31 January 2018 under the topic "How to Use NAPs, NDCs and the SDGs to Advance Climate Resilience in Asia-Pacific?" This email-based discussion was moderated by Chochoe Devaporihartakula, Programme Manager of IGES.


The Exchange drew contributions from the region, including from government officials representing Thailand's National Economic and Social Development Board (NESDB) and Mongolia's Ministry of Environment and Tourism. Adaptation experts from other organisations, such as Center for Natural Resource Studies (CNRS) and Climate Action Network-International (CAN), Institute for Global Environmental Strategies (IGES) and former Team Leader of Capacity Building of USAID Adapt Asia-Pacific also shared their views on this exchange series.

Based on the Exchange, the community members of APAN Network broadly agreed that there is a need to ratchet up the adaptation ambitions under the Paris Agreement and that the NAPs and NDCs should be aligned with the SDGs. Other suggested that there is a need to draw from the NAPs, NDCs and SDGs synergistic programmes and projects to enhance climate resilient development with possible support from regional bodies like SPREP and ASEAN who may follow the EU example and develop a regional NDC covering both mitigation and adaptation.

The 15th APAN Exchange Series:

Mainstreaming Gender into Climate Change Adaptation Programmes and Policies



The 15th APAN Exchange on Climate Change Adaptation (email-based discussion) was conducted from 8–22 March 2018 under the topic "Mainstreaming Gender into Climate Change Adaptation Programmes and Policies". This Exchange was launched on the International Women's Day to encourage community members of APAN Network to reflect on the issues of gender equality, analysis and integrated planning as it relates to climate change adaptation. This APAN Exchange was facilitated by Dr. Peter King, Senior Policy Advisor of IGES and Sibyl Nelson, Gender Advisor of Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), and was moderated by Chochoe Devaporihartakula, Programme Manager of IGES.


The Exchange drew detailed responses sent from DAI (USAID partner), UN Environment (UNEP), The Asian-Pacific Resource & Research Centre for Women (ARROW), Population Reference Bureau, the United States (PRB), Bangladesh Water Partnership (BWP), International Centre for Diarrhoeal Disease Research, Bangladesh (icddr,b), Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UNESCAP), representing many sectors including water, health, and environment. The inputs covered a range of examples and included encouraging words as well as indications of challenges still to be met in the promotion of gender equality.

Based on the Exchange, contributors had many insights to offer on the key gender issues relevant to adaptation planning. They wrote about how climate change impacts women and men differently, and therefore adaptation responses need to take into account the different productive and reproductive roles of women and men, as well as their different needs and vulnerabilities. The issues of empowerment of different actors (women, local government), and the importance of engaging different perspectives through active participation in adaptation planning were cited.

The 16th APAN Exchange Series:

Climate Change Impact Assessments and Adaptation Planning in the Small Island Developing States (SIDS)



The 16th APAN Exchange on Climate Change Adaptation (email-based discussion) was conducted from 22 March – 3 April 2018 under the topic "Climate Change Impact Assessments and Adaptation Planning in the Small Island Developing States (SIDS)". This Exchange was launched to highlight the importance of climate change adaptation in the Pacific islands which have not been addressed comprehensively in our other Exchange. This email-based discussion was facilitated by Dr. Peter King, Senior Policy Advisor of IGES and Tagaloa Cooper-Halo, Director of Climate Change Resilience of Secretariat of the Pacific Regional Environment Programme (SPREP), and was moderated by Chochoe Devaporihartakula, Programme Manager of IGES.

Due to unexpected delays in availability of the facilitator in the Pacific which are beyond our control, we unfortunately had to postpone the launching date of the 16th Exchange. Therefore, it is currently ongoing, and thus far, has drawn 2 contributions, including from government official from Ministry of Environment and Energy of Maldives and partner from International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN).

Based on the Exchange, contributors stressed that only a National Adaptation Programme of Action (NAPA) has been adopted by Maldives and Pacific Island Countries (PICs) while National Action Plans (NAPs) have not yet been adopted or listed on UNFCCC website. Adaptation projects have been in progress or undertaken aligned with proritisations defined in NAPA. Land acquisition and reclamation occur in some PICs, such as Kiribati and Tuvalu. There is still a question whether there have been enough actions in the current process at the national, regional and international level to bring out changes that are needed particularly in SIDS who are already facing the impacts of the changing climate.
