In Asia and the Pacific, there was an emergence of a strong national and regional approach for cooperation on Sustainable Consumption and Production (SCP) implementation. There has been significant progress in promoting and implementing SCP in the region through stakeholder involvement and through a continuous effort for knowledge sharing and private-public partnerships, in line with the global frameworks for cooperation, particularly its contribution to the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) 12 and related SDGs. It is important to build on what has been done through these initiatives and to provide the platform for dialogue on how to build and strengthen partnerships to move forward together and emerge stronger towards green recovery post-CoVID-19 pandemic.

The Asia Pacific Roundtable on Sustainable Consumption and Production (APRSCP) is a regional convening network that has been providing a sound platform for multi-stakeholder dialogue and partnerships to advance SCP in the region. In the past 20 years, we have convened 14 Regional Roundtables on SCP and this upcoming 15th APRSCP will be hosted by the Philippines together with supporting partners. Key Words

Transition, sustainable lifestyle, stakeholder engagement (including new business development and social development)

Concept

In the era of decarbonization, plastic-free society, green recovery from COVID 19 and SDGs, objectives and goals of SCP has been expanded beyond the area of environmental policy and strategy and into socio-technical system design to achieve sustainable lifestyle and well-being of the society as a whole. This requires effective multi-stakeholder engagement and consensus building for infrastructure and business model changes. In order to deepen the debate on SCP policies required in the future, it is necessary to change the way of thinking on environmental policies such as conventional regulations and economic tools, and to expand it to introduce new approaches and innovation in lifestyle and infrastructure. This session will discuss how we can effectively engage different stakeholders into policy and social design processes and to promote new business and social models which can sustain lifestyles within planetary boundaries.

Webisode 4 questions:

- 1. What are the 2-3 priority topics/issues on SCP in coming 2-3 years (in addition to green recovery, circular economy and plastics)?
- 2. What kind of approaches/experience are there for facilitating transition to sustainable lifestyles?
- 3. What kind of role local governments/communities can play in facilitating transition to sustainable lifestyle and green recovery?
- 4. How can we facilitate new business models for SCP such as CE business models?
