Children live at extremely high risk to impacts of climate change

88%

### Challenges

- 1. Essential services are not adapted to the impacts of the climate crisis
- 2.Policies and strategies to address climate change do not incorporate children's rights
- 3. Children and young people do not have opportunities to participate and influence climate action
- 4. Mitigation measures are not sufficient



#### **UNICEF** work

1. Essential services adapted to strengthen community resilience, specially where most needed (indigenous communities, urban centres' peripheries, etc.)

2.Children's rights, unique needs and vulnerabilities are integrated into climate policy

3. Empower children and young people to be climate defenders

4.Advocate for **ambitious climate mitigation**
