1. Introduction

Why Suginami needs the CCA?

"Moving from symbolic participation to substantive impact"

Problems with Conventional Methods:

"Why do most citizen assemblies produce recommendations that look exactly like existing administrative plans?"

Background: Often in the CCAs, participants simply 'copy and paste' what experts say.

Our Challenge: Avoid this "Echo Chamber", by bridging the gap between expert data/information and the 'lived experience' of citizens.



The Four Core Philosophies of the Suginami Model

2. The Core Challenge

The Logical Flow of 4 Core Philosophies

- Bridging the gap between expert knowledge and lived experience (Input/Learning process)
- 2. Ownership through deliberation (Process)
- 3. Avoiding the 'copy-paste' of administrative plans (Output)
- 4. Moving from symbolic participation to substantive impact (Substantive change)



Outline of Suginami CCA

- Participants: 77
 - Invitations were sent to 5,000 randomly selected residents out of 570,000 inhabitants,
 - 199 responded (4%) and were selected to be representative on the actual gender ratio, age structure and residential area of the ward.
- Sectors: 4 (Energy, Transport, Circular society and Urban Green)
- Process

From Information to Inspiration (Mindset Building to foster Ownership)

The 'Five Steps' to Foster Ownership" → Knowledge curation process in Suginami

- ① Why must we address climate change at the local level?
- Why must the current generation bear the burden for the sake of future generations?
- Why use a "Citizens' Assembly", instead of administration or local assembly, to discuss Suginami's climate strategy?
- Why is it necessary for Suginami residents to take the lead in taking action?
- (5) How will Suginami-Ward Office actually treat the recommendations made by this assembly?

Impactful recommendations

Waste: Citizens didn't just talk about recycling. They questioned the very definition of 'waste' and proposed a ward-wide composting system.


 Media Response: Tokyo Shinbun highlighted how a single resident's realization—"Is food waste not a resource?"—moved the local government to start studying composting.

Energy: they proposed 'Suginami Power'—a local energy company to ensure resilience and local circularity.

Mobility: they suggested bold ideas like aerial walkways or ropeways to solve local transit gaps. These ideas were 'unfiltered' and 'ambitious.

Media Response to overall: Asahi Shinbun recognized Suginami as one of the first successful cases of implementing the European Citizens' Assembly model at a Japanese local level.
