What Have We Learned from COVID-19


- Stems from unsustainable interaction between nature and human activities
- Illustrates rapid globalization's negative impacts
- Reinforces need to accelerate progress on SDGs...
- ...but speed as well as quality of development is essential
- Achieving high quality development requires harnessing globalization's positive impacts while living harmoniously with nature
- This will require working across sectors and including different stakeholders: sectoral integration and social inclusion

Analysis of Interlinkages Between SDGs


- The diagram illustrates interlinkages for six environmental goals: SDG 6, 7, 12, 13, 14, and 15 based on IGES interlinkages tool
- Its shows that there are more synergies in PHL and KHM than JPN
- This suggests that there may be higher costs and fewer co-benefits for climate actions in JPN than PHL and KHM



Create Local Circulating and Ecological Sphere (Local CES): Support both integration of sectors and inclusion of stakeholders





Support integration and inclusion with multi-level nested governance

A policymaking system that recognizes that natural capital does not fit neatly into administrative levels and boundaries

- Sustainably managing this capital requires coalitions of policymakers and environmental experts to work across levels and boundaries
- These coalitions can ensure policies reflect local conditions as well as recent scientific assessments (e.g. GBO, IPBES)
