

Types and Depths of Engagement

Approach	Definitions
Partnership	Stakeholders participate in decision-making process and/or exert control over resources, through a formal or informal agreement to work together toward common objectives.
Collaboration	Stakeholders and ADB work jointly, but stakeholders have limited control over decision-making and resources.
Consultation	Stakeholder input is requested and considered as part of an inclusive policy, program, or project decision-making process.
Information Generation and Sharing	Information is: (i) generated by ADB/recipient/client and shared with stakeholders; (ii) independently generated by stakeholders and shared with ADB/recipient/client; or (iii) jointly produced.
