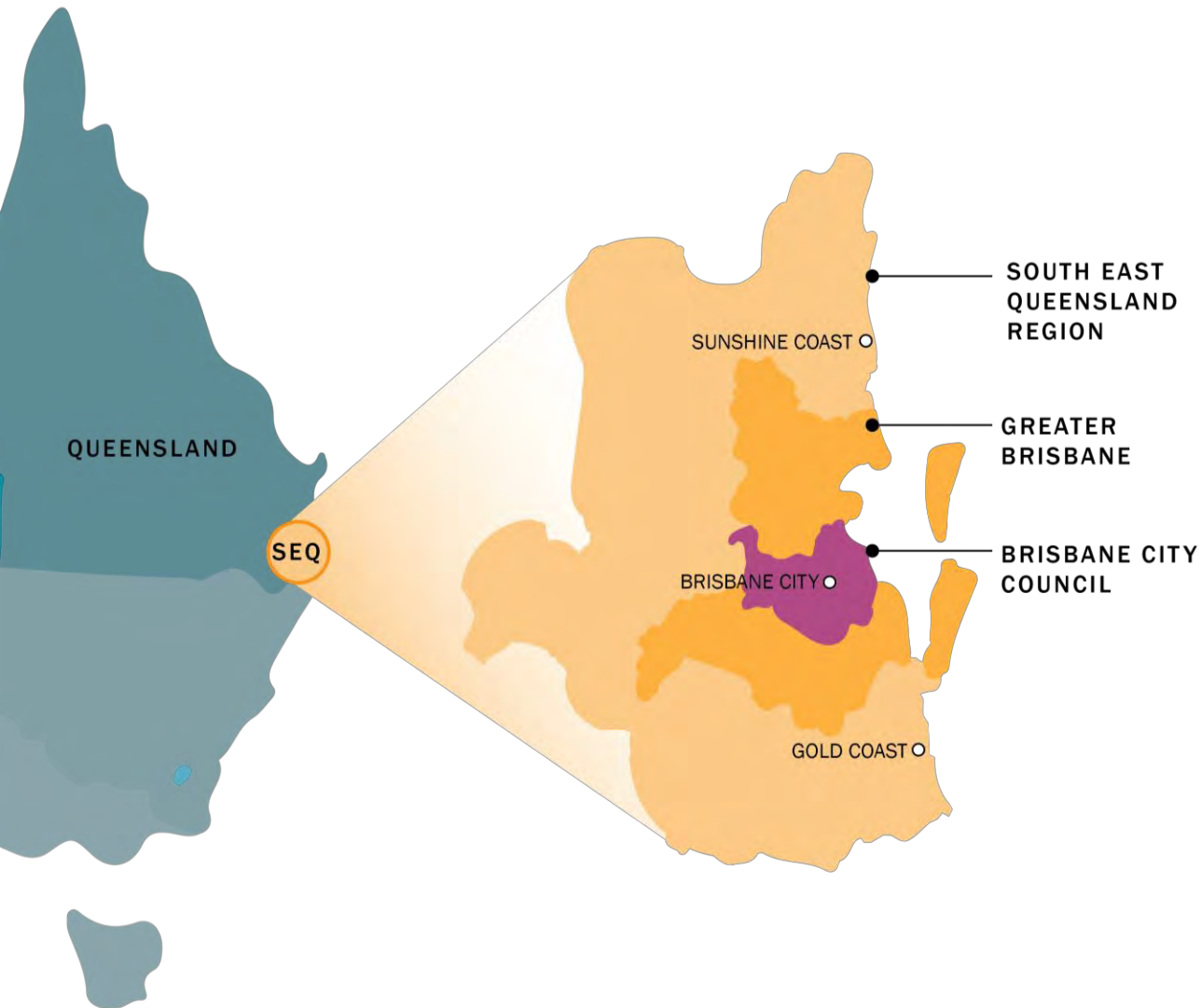

Our Community

- Largest local government in Australia
- Population: 1,280,504
- 35 years median age
- 36% of residents born outside Australia
- 28% speak a language other than English

Our Environment

- 1,342.7 km² land area
- Sub-tropical, with 283 days of sunshine every year
- 38.9% natural habitat cover
- Over 2,100 parks and natural areas
- 800+ wildlife species and 2,500 native plants
- Brisbane River 114 km in length

Our Economy

- Australia's fastest growing city
- Budget > \$3.9 billion
- Over \$34 billion in assets
- 917,151 employed, 68% live and work in Brisbane
- \$180 billion Greater Brisbane economy
- 5.3 million visitors
- Top 15% for innovation out of 450 cities worldwide

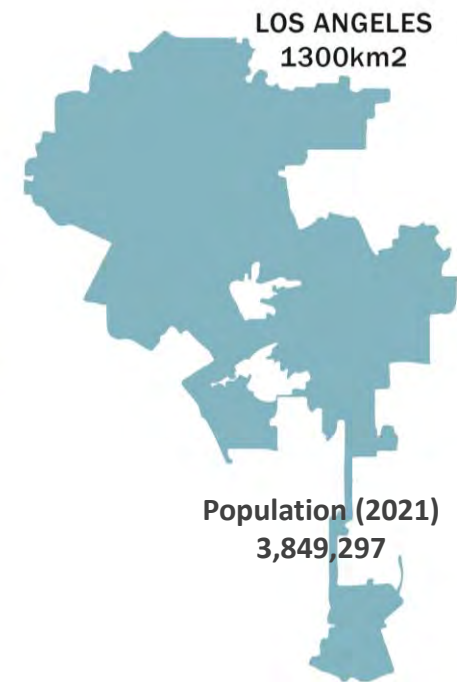

- Australia's largest certified carbon neutral government organisation since 2016
- Clean air city

Achievements to date

- First Australian capital city to release a Clear Air Strategy
- Australia's largest carbon neutral certified government organisation
- 38.9% natural habitat cover
- Household food waste down 37%
- Australia's most biodiverse capital city
- 76 million bus trips annually (up 59%)
- 4,300+ hectares of bushland protected
- 575,000+ street trees
- 2,200+ parks



Delivering a low carbon city

Initiatives:

- Switching to low emissions public transport fleet
- Constructing new green bridges to make it easier to get around on foot and by bike or scooter
- Capturing landfill gas and generating renewable energy at city landfills
- Installing solar power systems and energy savings technologies
- Continuing to grow our urban forest
