Asian Transparency Workshop (Online)

December 13-14, 2021

This Asian Transparency Workshop organized by the Ministry of the Environment, Japan (MOEJ), IGES, UNFCCC-RCC and UNEP-DTU Partnership aims to promote knowledge sharing among countries in Asia for the effective implementation of the Paris Agreement's Enhanced Transparency Framework (ETF). Together with other on-going activities¹, this workshop forms part of Japan's initiatives for transparency capacity building.

Overall objective:

Building on activities under the Mutual Learning Program² for Enhanced Transparency (MLP) in 2021, the overall objective of this Asian Transparency Workshop is to strengthen understanding of how to prepare reporting under the ETF and share good reporting practices among countries in the region. We will also discuss the outcomes of the international negotiations and discussions at COP26 in Glasgow in November 2021. Out of the reporting elements required under the ETF, we will focus on:

- Day 1: Reporting of mitigation actions under Article 13
- Day 2: Reporting under Article 6.2
